



Crochet Hook Size Conversion Chart

*The safest and easiest way to identify hook size is via the Metric System. Sizing tools are available to assist in identifying hook size where printing has worn off.



Crochet Hook Sizes By Yarn Weight

Yarn Weight	Typical Hook
Lace (0)	1.5–2.25 mm
Super Fine (1)	2.25–3.5 mm
Fine (2)	3.5–4.5 mm
Light (3)	4.0–5.0 mm
Medium/Worsted (4)	5.0–6.0 mm
Bulky (5)	6.5–9.0 mm
Super Bulky (6)	9.0–15.0 mm
Jumbo (7)	15.0 mm+

Hook sizes vary from yarn to yarn due to actual yarn size as well as individual gauge/tension. Hook size may need to be adjusted up (bigger) or down (smaller) to achieve correct gauge.

It's best to ALWAYS crochet a test swatch (gauge) to check for gauge/tension. when creating garments. It may not be as important for items like scarves or wraps where "fit" is not critical.

A test swatch should be created for every square in the Fibre Arts for the Soul Sampler Afghan to ensure your squares line up when joining. Your Single Crochet Square will be your control square. Creating swatches will also provide practice working each stitch.
